One of many projects involves partnering with the Pee Dee Workforce Investment Board to enhance the overall workforce through the development and support of the SC Job Ready Certification website.

HillSouth's slogan is "Never Stop Thinking"; the company's extensive charity work shows they never stop caring, either.

S.C. Lieutenant Governor Andre Bauer delivered the keynote address at the annual luncheon.

This year's theme -- "S.C. Works -- Keys to Our Future Success" -- was about uniting all of the state to make it a better place to live and work.

There was also a special tribute to businesses which not only hire veterans but keep their jobs open for them in the event the veterans are deployed.
